Sample Preparation

- Samples should be prepared in accordance with the specific instructions for the group.
- The dilutions specified should be conducted in such a way as to ensure that any
 errors introduced by this dilution are much smaller than the overall analytical error
 involved in your method. As a general rule it is suggested that the error from dilution
 should be less than 1%.
- Example dilutions are given for illustration to help clarify the meaning of the instructions. These procedures should be followed exactly to ensure comparability of results.

Any dilutions detailed as part of these procedures should not be used in the calculation of results. These dilutions simply provide a final sample for analysis within the expected concentration ranges.

Sample Analysis

- Samples should be analysed by the normal methods used for those analytes by your laboratory.
- CONTEST samples should be treated like any other samples and all normal quality control procedures should be adopted.
- Results should only be corrected for recovery and blank, if appropriate, and if this
 is the normal practice in the laboratory. If the sample is diluted as part of the
 analytical process (this is apart from the dilutions in the sample preparation
 instructions), such dilutions should be corrected for.
